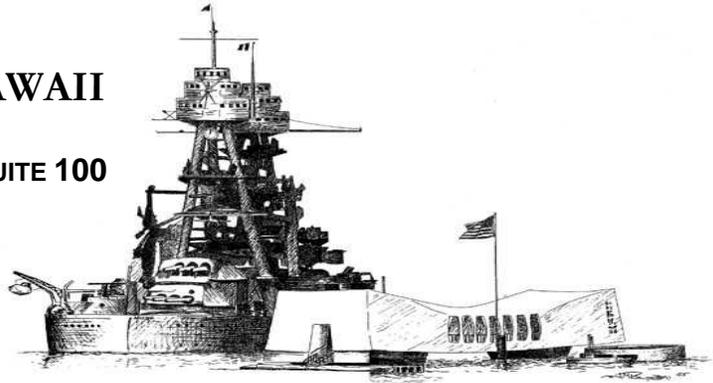

Pearl Harbor 65th Anniversary Commemoration

FOR GUIDANCE AND PLANNING PURPOSES ONLY

What: Pearl Harbor 65th Anniversary Commemoration

When: December 7, 2006, 7:40 a.m.

Where: Kilo Pier, Naval Station Pearl Harbor

Media Credential: All media should have submitted a Joint Media Credential Application. If you have not, please complete and fax or email the attached application to Navy Region Hawaii.

Media Access to Commemoration Site: By 6 a.m. on Dec 7, 2006, all media must check in at the Media Information Center at the Ohana Hale Building #103 at the Rainbow Bay Marina at Pearl Harbor (past USS *Arizona* Memorial Visitor Center and USS *Bowfin* Museum) for transport and escort to the Commemoration site. **Please be prompt.** If you need earlier access to the Commemoration site, please contact Navy Region Hawaii Public Affairs Office in advance at 808-473-2888 to make arrangements.

Media Platforms: All media will have access to two (2) media platforms. One is positioned at the back of the Ceremony seating and one is on the side. This back platform will offer two levels for media to position their cameras – 4 feet high and 8 feet high. The side platform is 4 feet high.

Media Pool Teams: To maintain the solemnity and formality of the Commemoration, media on the main Ceremony floor will be restricted to pool video and still photography teams who were approved by the National Park Service and Navy Region Hawaii. All pool photographers and videographers will be identified by special badges. **ALL OTHER MEDIA MUST STAY WITHIN THE MEDIA BOUNDARIES AND PLATFORMS AS INDICATED ON THE ATTACHED MAP.**

Still Photo Pools: The Associated Press, Honolulu Advertiser, Honolulu Star-Bulletin, U.S. Navy and Reuters will each have a still photographer positioned on the main Ceremony floor to serve as pool cameras. Photos will be posted and available through the Associated Press and Reuters. Media or photographers, who are not members of the Associated Press or Reuters, may contact Navy Region Hawaii public affairs for photos.

Video Photo Pools: A broadcast crew has been hired by the National Park Service to provide a live microwave broadcast of the Commemoration transmitted to the movie theaters and TV monitors at the USS *Arizona* Memorial Visitor Center. The Broadcast crew will also provide a 3-camera switched feed box at Kilo Pier for broadcast media to plug into to receive a live feed. Technical details of the feed are below. The National Park Service will also have a documentary film crew on the main ceremony floor.

Media Briefing and Commemoration Site Inspection, Tues., Dec 5, 7 a.m. All media are invited to send a representative to attend a media briefing and site inspection at Kilo Pier on Naval Station Pearl Harbor. All chairs, staging and media platforms will be in place on site and audio and broadcast feed technician crews will be available for questions at the Ohana Hale Building #103 at the Rainbow Bay Marina at Pearl Harbor (past USS *Arizona* Memorial Visitor Center and USS *Bowfin* Museum). In order to provide access and escort on board Naval Station Pearl Harbor and the Commemoration site, please contact Navy Region Hawaii Public Affairs Office by close of business Dec 4, 2006 with the name of media representative attending.

After Commemoration Coverage: The Still Photography Pool media covering the ceremony will also continue their coverage with a photo opportunity (still photo only-no interviews) of the informal floral tribute on board the USS *Arizona* Memorial directly following the completion of the ceremony. Videographic coverage (B-roll only-no interviews) is limited to predesignated organizations including local TV news affiliates and U.S. Navy

Remaining media may also proceed on to the 11:30 a.m. Pacific Aviation Museum Grand Opening and/or the 12:30 p.m. USS *Oklahoma* Memorial Groundbreaking Ceremony on Ford Island. Transportation and media escorts will be provided.

The Press Box: "Whirlwind PressPower 2" has 16 XLR outputs that are mic/line switchable. It features 2 mic/line inputs with individual gain controls and 16 transformer isolated outputs that are individually switchable for mic or line level operation. The high-performance input stage provides clean audio even in high RF environments.
