

## Blues On The Bay



The 2007 Kaneohe Marine Corps-Navy Air Show, "The Blues on the Bay," took place Oct. 13-14. In addition to the Blue Angels, a supporting cast of performers thrilled thousands. Numerous static displays, rides, food and souvenirs were available for those on hand for the weekend event.

The U.S. Navy's Blue Angels Flight Demonstration Squadron is among the most popular aviation acts in the world, entertaining 15 million people last air show season. Since they were formed in 1946, they have performed for more than 400 million people.

The Blue Angels' mission is to enhance Navy and Marine Corps recruiting and to represent the naval service to the United States civilian community, its elected leadership and foreign nations. The Blue Angels serve as positive role models and goodwill ambassadors for the U.S. Navy and Marine Corps.

A Blue Angels' flight demonstration exhibits the choreographed refinements of Navy-trained flying skills. It includes the graceful, aerobatic maneuvers of the four-plane diamond formation, in concert with fast-paced high performance maneuvers of its two solo pilots. Finally, the team illustrates the pinnacle of precision flying, performing maneuvers locked as a unit in the renowned, six-jet delta formation.

Other performers included Patty Wagstaff, Greg Poe, Mike Wiscus, Jill Long, Tim Weber, Hank Bruckner, the Red Bull Helo, the Army Golden Knights, the Navy Leap Frogs, the Navy SH-60 and the USCG SAR Ops.



# Navy presents Lehua students with energy conservation awards

Capt. Donald Hodge, chief of staff for Navy Region Hawai'i and Naval Surface Group Middle Pacific, presented seven children from Lehua Elementary School in Pearl City with certificates of recognition on Oct. 12 at the school. The children won the Naval Facilities Engineering Command (NAVFAC) Hawai'i Energy Conservation School Outreach Program Bookmark Contest.

The students, many of whom are military family members, designed bookmarks to display what they had learned from energy conservation awareness education conducted by representatives from NAVFAC Hawai'i.

"The elementary school children here are a motivating force for parents to save energy and save electricity," said Hodge, who explained the importance of saving energy on Navy installations

and in family housing.

"If we save energy in our military housing, it saves the Navy money and that's money we need these days to

operate our ships, our submarines and our airplanes. This complements everything we are doing at Navy Region Hawai'i and aboard all of our

ships to conserve energy, save money and save our precious resources," stated Hodge.

Krista Stehn, energy awareness manager for NAV-

FAC Hawai'i, visited the school Sept. 21 and conducted two presentations explaining what energy is, how energy is used, and ways to conserve energy.

"It's simple things they can do on a daily basis like turning off lights or the air conditioner when they leave a room, making sure the windows and doors are closed when the air conditioner is on, turning off computers, TVs, your Playstation, whatever uses energy," said Stehn. "We instill simple things they can do on a daily basis while they're young so they grow up being a little bit more aware of their energy use and ways that they can conserve it."

Using what they had learned from the presentation, the students designed bookmarks which were later judged on how well they related to energy conservation and how creative they were.

One bookmark design was chosen from each grade to be printed and distributed to students throughout the school.

NAVFAC Hawai'i's Energy Conservation School Outreach Program was kicked off in August to provide education on the importance of saving energy to students in schools with a high concentration of Navy family members.

Three local schools participated in the program: Pearl Harbor Kai Elementary School, Lehua Elementary School and Aliamanu Middle School.

"[The program] benefits everyone greatly and we appreciate the Navy's support," said Fay Toyama, principal of Lehua Elementary School.

Students from Pearl Harbor Kai and Lehua Elementary School competed in bookmark contests and students from Aliamanu Middle School participated in a poster contest.

Winning bookmark and poster designs from all three schools will be on display during Energy Awareness Month in October at the Navy Exchange at Pearl Harbor.




