Friends, families and water enthusiasts of Naval Station Pearl Harbor soaked up the sun at Marina Family Fun Day, an annual event hosted by Naval Station Hawai'i Morale, Welfare and Recreation (MWR) and Rainbow Bay Marina.

The free fun day was held May 17 at Rainbow Bay Marina for active duty service members, their sponsored guests, retirees and Department of Defense civilians.

"This is our fifth annual Marina Family Fun Day," said Gerald Hamilton, outdoor recreation program director. "We want to do this before summer so we can give people

an idea of what [kinds of water recreational activities] we have to offer."

The event featured a variety of water leisure activities geared toward the whole family, including boat rides around the harbor, canoe and sailboat lessons as well as food and entertainment.

"The idea [with this event] is to introduce everyone to boating and other water sports," Hamilton said. "That is why we have experts in their fields at this event that can help if you have a specific question or are interested in any of our swimming or sailing activities."

According to Hamilton, several boating clubs and experts from the outdoor recreational program facility were on hand to give personal demonstra-

tions to patrons interested in canoeing, sailing or outrigger kayaking. The U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary was also present to perform complimentary vessel safety inspections, he added.

George Kao, manager at the Rainbow Bay Marina, said the fun-filled event gave families a chance to enjoy water sports in a safe, family-friendly setting.

"This event is for our military families and their dependents," said Kao. "We want them to see what kind of fun programs are available to them at the marina as well as encourage some people who may have

never tried a particular water activity, such as canoeing or kayaking, to give them a try."

Master-at-Arms 1st Class Brad Borum from the security training department at Naval Station Pearl Harbor said he found out about Marina Family Fun day online at MWR's Web site while signing up his child for a youth camp.

"I am glad we came," he said at the event. "This is something that is great for any family. We [as a military community] should take our kids out and let them enjoy the water and all of the fun things available to us here in Hawai'i."

An Army spouse and parent said she agreed that more military service members and family members should

take advantage of events and resources offered to them. "I think everyone should be here," she said. "It's fun, it's free and there is something the whole family can do here. Our kids are having a blast."

Hamilton said that kayaks, pontoon boats and other boating equipment are available to the military community to rent. "There are free swimming lessons and many different programs that we offer that are hard to beat," he said. "We hope our [naval] commands, service members and families keep us in mind when they decide how they will spend their summer."

Pearl Harbor historic sites free to military, families Memorial Day



The Pearl Harbor Historic Sites partners will offer complimentary general admission to all active-duty, reserve and retired U.S. military personnel and their family members on Memorial Day on May 26. Qualified visitors must present a valid military I.D. upon entering the historic site or sites of their choice.

Applicable historic sites include the USS Bowfin Submarine Museum and Park, Battleship Missouri Memorial and Pacific Aviation Museum – Pearl Harbor. (The USS Arizona Memorial and recently dedicated USS Oklahoma Memorial, both operated and maintained by the National Park Service, already offer free daily admission.)

The Pearl Harbor Historic Sites provide a powerful historical journey unlike any other, an experience that has matured and grown far beyond that of a mere single day. These memorials and museums carry forth the legacies of several of our nation's most treasured icons, are enduring tributes to the valor and sacrifices of our veterans, and provide windows into a past era when the future of our nation and the world truly hung in the balance.

Memorial Day, traditionally observed on the last Monday of May, commemorates all fallen U.S. men and women who gave their lives in military service to their country. Its origins began as a tribute to Union Soldiers during the American Civil War. Following the First



World War, the observance was expanded to include those who died in any war or military action.

USS Arizona Memorial

The USS Arizona, dedicated on Memorial Day 1962, is the final resting place for 1,177 crew members who lost their lives on Dec. 7, 1941. The memorial honors and commemorates all members of the U.S. Armed Forces and civilians who gave their lives to their country during the attack on Pearl Harbor. In 1980, Congress mandated that the USS Arizona Memorial would become a unit of the National Park Service. The USS Arizona Memorial Visitors Center is open daily

from 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. General admission is free. Tickets are issued on a first-come, first-served basis. For more information, call 422-0561 or visit www.nps.gov/usar/.

USS Bowfin Submarine Museum and Park

The USS Bowfin Submarine Museum and Park, operated as a private, non-profit organization, is dedicated to the sacrifice of more than 3,500 submarine personnel lost in World War II. This gallant band of brothers, comprising less than two percent of the U.S. Navy, sank more than 5.5 million tons of enemy ships, while sustaining losses of 52 submarines that remain on

'eternal patrol.' The USS Bowfin Submarine Museum and Park is open daily from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. General admission is \$10 per adult and \$4 per child for ages four-12. Military, kama'aina (local resident) and school group pricing is available. For more information, call 423-1341 or visit www.bowfin.org.

Battleship Missouri Memorial

America's last battleship, the USS Missouri (BB-63), completed an astounding career spanning five decades and three wars — World War II, Korea and Operation Desert Storm — and is best known as the site of Japan's WWII surrender,

which brought history's most devastating war to a close. Today, the 887-foot, 45,000-ton "Mighty Mo" is open for visitors as the Battleship Missouri Memorial, a private, non-profit organization, on historic Ford Island in Pearl Harbor. The Battleship Missouri Memorial is open daily from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. General admission is \$16 per adult and \$8 per child ages four-12. Military, kama'aina (local resident) and school group pricing is available. For more information or to reserve a tour, call (toll-free) 1-877-MIGHTY-MO (1-877-644-4896) or visit www.ussmissouri.org.

- Pearl Harbor

The Pacific Aviation Museum – Pearl Harbor, also operated as a private, non-profit organization, occupies the WWII hangars and control tower on Ford Island that still bear the scars as our nation's first aviation battlefield. Giving visitors a front-row seat to the Pacific Theater and presenting aircraft and their stories, the museum illustrates how aviation turned the tide of the war. The museum is open daily from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. General admission is \$14 per adult and \$7 per child ages four-12. Military, kama'aina (local resident) and school group pricing is available. For more information, call 441-1000 or visit www.pacificaviationmuseum.org.

USS Oklahoma Memorial

A lasting and fitting memorial created in honor of the 429 Sailors and Marines lost aboard the USS Oklahoma on Dec. 7, 1941, the USS Oklahoma Memorial was dedicated exactly 66 years later on Ford Island last year and is maintained under the stewardship of the National Park Service. The memorial lists the names of the fallen on granite slabs and marble standards, remembering the heroism and tragedy of that day of infamy. The memorial is open daily from 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Admission is free. Transportation for those without naval base access is available via the Battleship Missouri Memorial / Pacific Aviation Museum shuttle for \$3 per person (redeemable at site retail stores). Pacific Aviation Museum to present 'Return to Midway' - the 66th Anniversary Commemoration

Pacific Aviation Museum

This year marks the 66th anniversary of the June 4, 1942 Battle of Midway, a crucial turning point for America in World War II. To commemorate this historic event, the Pacific Aviation Museum Pearl Harbor and Hawai'i's own "hometown historian" and Midway expert, Alan Lloyd, will present a two-part lecture series entitled "Miracles and Mysteries Surrounding Midway Revealed" at 2 p.m. June 1 and at 7 p.m. June 2.

The lectures will discuss the interrelation of post-Pearl Harbor attack events: The second bombing of Pearl Harbor on March 4, 1942, the Doolittle Raid on Tokyo April 18, 1942, the attack on Alaska's Aleutian Islands on June 4, 1942 and the Battle of Midway on June 4, 1942.

Seating is limited and reservations are required by May 28 to drive onto Ford Island, the home of the Pacific Aviation Museum. Call 441-1008. Kama'aina and military rates are \$10 for adults and \$5 for keiki.

General admission is \$14 for adults and \$7 for children. Admission is free for museum members who give their membership number when making reservations.

Additionally, Military Historical Tours will conduct an actual tour to Midway Island on June 4. For more information, visit www.miltours.com. Mention the Pacific Aviation Museum when you sign up and receive a free admission to the "Return to Midway" lectures.

The Pacific Aviation Museum is located in the historic hangers of Ford Island which witnessed the surprise attack by the Imperial Japanese Navy on Pearl Harbor on Dec. 7, 1941. Its mission is to develop and maintain an internationally recognized aviation museum which educates young and old alike, honors aviators and the support personnel who defended freedom in the Pacific Region, and is dedicated to preserving Pacific aviation history.

Daily, visitors from all over

the world view the planes' enjoy exciting hands on technology experiences such as the air flight simulator, hear the stories told by veteran docents and see "The Day That Shall Live In Infamy" through historic films and audio. The museum gift shop and restaurant are unique in their offerings and their authentic 1940s ambiance. The museum has recently announced its phase two capital campaign for the restoration of two additional standing hangars and the landmark red and white icon control tower. This restoration will house the increasing aircraft collection which will include an Air Force F-15 Screaming Eagle and the last Navy F-14 Tomcat to be flown in the service of our nation.

Pacific Aviation Museum is open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily and is accessed by shuttles from Bowfin Park at Pearl Harbor. For more information, call 441-1000 or visit www.PacificAviationMuseum.org.

Just in time for the 10th anniversary of the Battleship Missouri's arrival in Hawai'i this June, the Battleship Missouri Memorial has completed an extensive refit of its Web site www.usmissouri.org, providing a more interactive, informative experience and new online reservation capabilities.

Travel professionals and event planners can explore options available to their clientele and make contact with staff for one-on-one briefings. And history buffs and battleship enthusiasts can browse in-depth information about the ship's role in three wars, including a photo collage, as well as detailed ship specifications and blueprints.

For those interested in lending their support to the memorial, whether through volunteer efforts or monetary donations, the Web site provides information about contributing to the ongoing preservation of the Missouri.

The "Friends of the Mighty Mo" membership program is designed to give individuals, families and organizations the opportunity to invest contributions in the mission-driven education, preservation, outreach and legacy-building activities of the Battleship Missouri Memorial.


Member benefits include monthly updates and opportunities, including savings on visits to the Battleship Missouri, exclusive access, invitations to member-only




