

Child Care Fees and Subsidy

Did you know?

As an eligible parent using the Navy Child Development Home (CDH) Program, you may be eligible to receive a subsidy to help pay for the care of your child.

To qualify:

- Your child must be a dependent and between the ages of six weeks and 12 years.
- Must use a Navy Certified CDH Provider
- Must require full time care. Full time is defined as 25-50 hours per week for children 6 weeks through Kindergarten and up to 30 hours per week for school age children (1st- 6th grade). When school is not in session children must attend 25-50 hours per week.

Calculating Fees:

- Subsidized fees are based on Total Household Income (THI) and are consistent with the fees charged at Navy Child and Youth Centers. THI is defined as all earned income including wages, salaries, tips, long-term disability benefits, voluntary salary deferrals, quarters allowances, and subsistence received by any adults, married or not, residing together as one economic unit and sharing living expenses toward the benefit of the children in residence.
- Providers may charge additional fees if more than 50 hours of care per week are provided. CDH providers set their own fees for part-time and extended care or for care involving children that do not qualify for subsidy. Descriptions of all fees should be included in the Parent/Provider Contract and parent should receive a copy of the Parent/Provider Contract before their child starts care.

To apply:

- Contact the Child Development Home Program in your area to set up a time to come into the office and complete the subsidy paperwork.
