In an improved effort to stay green and eco-friendly, Naval Support Activity (NSA) Naples' Public Works Department set up two, new recycling collection centers for residents at the Support Site.

## Gaiani relieves Mercer as commander of Navy Region

Rear Adm. Tony E. Gaiani relieved Rear Adm. David J. Mercer as Commander, Navy Region Europe, Africa, Southwest Asia (EURAFSWA) and Commander, Maritime Air Naples, Aug. 20, during a change of command ceremony at Naval Support Activity Naples.

The outdoor ceremony was attended by distinguished NATO, U.S. and Italian government officials. Italian Navy Vice Adm. Maurizio Gemignani, Commander, Allied Maritime Command Naples, was the ceremony's presiding official.

Vice Adm. Michael Vitale, Commander, Navy Installations Command, the ceremony's guest speaker, reflected on the ongoing changes at Navy installations in the region and around the world. "It's a new era. If we ever wanted to reinvent our shore platform, now is the time. It is why we select shore leaders like Admiral Mercer and Admiral Gaiani," said Vitale.

During Mercer's tenure, he assumed administrative and operational control over Camp Lemonnier, Djibouti, U.S. Africa Command's only base on the African continent, only months after reporting to Naples as Commander, Navy Region Europe in March 2008.

In 2009, Mercer facilitated Navy Region Europe's merger with Navy Region Southwest Asia, leading the command through an official name change that now reflects its broader area of responsibility. The region currently includes six major military installations on three continents.

Vitale also presented Mercer with the Legion of Merit for his outstanding service and devotion to duty. "Everything Rear Admiral Mercer and his team have accomplished here in EURAFSWA in the past 31 months has prepared [Mercer] well for his next assignment in Washington, D.C.," Vitale said. "To [Mercer] and the team, I say well done and thank you."

Mercer attributed EURAFSWA's milestones to the

team of installation and Region personnel serving as the logistics and support arm of U.S. Naval Forces Europe, U.S. Naval Forces Africa, and U.S. Naval Forces Central Command. "I can't tell you how gratified I am with what you've been able to achieve. Thank you for making good on many of the promises I made to our superior officers," said Mercer.

While directly addressing Italian dignitaries in attendance, Mercer thanked them for providing U.S. personnel a wonderful place to live and work. "Italy and the United States have been very good, strong allies since World War II," said Mercer. "We appreciate all you've done for us, and we thank you for your hospitality."

Mercer was relieved by Gaiani, a fellow naval aviator who previously commanded Navy Region Midwest. Gaiani was warmly received by Italian attendees during the ceremony when he opened his remarks in their native tongue.

"This assignment is sort of a homecoming for me. I come home again to naval aviation, as Commander, Maritime Air

Naples. I come home again to NATO, in my third assignment to the alliance. And, I come home again to Italy, which is where Colleen and I served in our first assignment, which seems to be a just few years ago now....Colleen and I are thrilled to be back in beautiful Italy, and thrilled to have this opportunity that this change of command represents for us," said Gaiani.

As Region commander, Gaiani oversees a total workforce of 4,417 host nation employees, U.S. employees and military members responsible for providing efficient and effective shore service support to U.S. and allied forces in the Europe, Africa and Southwest Asia area of responsibility.

As Commander, Maritime Air Naples, Gaiani coordinates NATO maritime patrol aircraft (MPA) activity in NATO's Southern Region area of operations in the Mediterranean. In addition, he maintains command and control of assigned MPA forces in support of Allied Maritime Command Naples—one of three component commands under Allied Joint Force Command Naples.

Welcome back everyone!

Whether it's from travels around Europe, a trip to the States, or una vacanza di distensione per Ferragosto, I'm glad you have returned safely. We've had quite a few new folks PCS into Naples during the summer, so make sure to welcome them, help answer a few of their questions and get them outside the fence line with a few suggested destinations.

School starts this Monday, August 30th, and the Support Site is going to get a lot busier. Please make sure you're mindful of pedestrians and additional vehicle traffic around the schools. Please continue to use common sense as you plan your weekend activities. 

Are you an American citizen who is at least 18 years old? If so, then voting is your constitutional right! There is still time to request your absentee ballot for the November general election, which is less 90 days away.

An absentee ballot is a vote cast by someone who is unable to attend the official polling station. The absentee voting process has been improved, allowing military members, their families and U.S. citizens living abroad to more easily cast their votes from overseas. ## Enlisted warfare qualifications: A mandatory requirement

Initial enlisted warfare qualifications are now mandatory for all sailors per the recent release of NAVADMIN 268-10. The NAVADMIN announced the release of OPNAVINST 1414.9, Navy Enlisted Warfare Qualification Programs Instruction, which issues the basic overarching requirements for the qualification and designation of all enlisted warfare programs.

Warfare programs are essential in ensuring sailors understand and are able to effectively engage a casualty, operate equipment or platforms safely and ensure backup as needed. Warfare qualifications are about ship, shipmate and self, and ensure the safety and safe operation of each command and platform on a daily basis.

"It's a standard every sailor must achieve. The warfare device itself is a symbol that the sailors who are wearing it have a basic level of knowledge to ensure they are capable of fighting the ship, saving a shipmate and ensuring the safety of themselves at all times," said Master Chief Petty Officer of the Navy Rick D. West. "Having every sailor at or working toward that level will only strengthen the war-fighting ability of that command and the Navy."

According to the NAVADMIN, qualification and/or re-qualification is mandatory for all enlisted sailors assigned to designated warfare qualifying commands.

Warfare sponsors (Type Commanders) will establish specific qualification and re-qualifying timelines however, the maximum allowable time for initial qualification of all enlisted sailors assigned to designated warfare qualifying commands will not exceed 30 months. Timelines for warfare qualifications are set by the Type Commander's instructions and each TYCOM will have oversight of their programs.

## Flu vaccine required

As outlined in AFJI 48-110, DoD policy concerning immunizations will follow the recommendations of the Center for Disease Control (CDC) and Advisory Committee on Immunization Practice (ACIP) unless there are medical/administrative reasons to do otherwise.

AFJI 48-110 mandates Department of Defense schoolteachers, day-care center workers and children attending DoD-sponsored schools and day-care centers or similar facilities on military installations be administered appropriate vaccines against communicable diseases unless medically or administratively exempt. The guidance specifically addresses administration of the influenza vaccine annually to schoolteachers, day-care workers, volunteers and attending children. For more information, stop by the Immunization Clinic at U.S. Naval Hospital Naples.

## School Liaison Officer Program

The life of the military child consists of many rewards and many stresses. Military children are encouraged to be independent and self-sufficient. Due to their high level of transitioning, military children are also positioned to perform exceptionally well in and out of the classroom. In addition to the stresses of transitioning, military students routinely encounter other difficulties. Naval Support Activity (NSA) Naples hired 19 summer workers as part of the annual Dependant Youth Employment Program. From June 21 through Aug. 20, the young adults worked in various offices around base, including Human Resources, NSA Public Affairs, Fleet Mail Center and many more. This program is designed to give adolescent dependents experience in the workplace and provide commands extra summertime help.

The Dependant Youth Employment Program serves the NSA Naples community every year. "It helps everyone: It helps the workplace because there are always gapped billets, so there's always a workload of things to do. It helps these kids by giving them experience in the workplace," explained Susan Carbone, human resource specialist and director of Dependant Youth Employment Program.

Jeremy Plante, a summer employee at the Fleet Mail Center, used the program to learn more about job opportunities. "I just graduated high school, so I thought it would be a good idea to join this program to get some work experience in different types of jobs," Plante said. "The sailors here at the mail center have been great. They've helped me gain a lot of experience while working here."

As the summer winds down and these employees go back to school or join the workforce, they will have gained some life experience from working with the Dependant Youth Employment Program. According to Carbone, "I think they will gain self knowledge. They may find out the job is something they never ever want to do again, but there are some cases where they find things they love and will pursue a career in that field. Sometimes a summer job can lead to a lifetime career."

## Obtaining your Sojourner Permit

Italian law requires all foreign personnel working or living within Italy, other than an active duty member under military orders, to obtain a Sojourner Permit within eight days of arrival in Italy. This is different from a visa, which is merely an approval for entry into the country.

All applicants over 14 years of age must apply in person, as each person's signature is required at the time of application.

**NATIONALS OF ANY STATE OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITY COMING TO ITALY DO NOT REQUIRE ANY VISA OR SOJOURNER PERMIT.**

As part of the Area Orientation process, the U.S. Region Legal Service Office (RLSO EURAFSWA) assists in the preparation and oversees the acquisition of the Sojourner Permit for all personnel attached to U.S. Navy commands in the Naples area. Army and Air Force personnel stationed at JFC must apply through the Carabinieri at the JFC Provost Marshall's Office, Building L.

## NSA Naples prepares for flu season

With the temperature slowly dropping and the daylight lessening, the threat of flu season, officially from October through May and peaking from December through March, draws closer every day.

"Influenza is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses. It can cause mild to severe illness, and at times can lead to death. Some people, such as older people, young children and people with certain health conditions, are at high risk for serious flu complications. The best way to prevent the flu is by getting vaccinated each year," said Lt. John Gardner, environmental health officer, U.S. Naval Hospital Naples.

The flu vaccine will arrive in Naples soon and will be given out in stages. "Currently, our first shipment of flu vaccine is scheduled to arrive in late September or early October. The vaccine will be distributed in the order directed by Navy policy: Military and civilian personnel ordered to deploy in support of an operational requirement or assigned to a ship regardless of location or deployment status; medically high risk people and health care workers in direct patient care and Navy emergency essential civilian personnel; basic and advanced trainees, officer trainees, midshipmen and the training cadre of these personnel; all other military personnel; all other mission essential or mission critical DoD civilian and contract employees; and all other beneficiaries," explained Gardner.

In addition to the vaccine, Gardner offered these simple tips to stop the spread of germs—the key factor in reducing the amount of illness in the area this flu season: "Take preventative measures to stop the spread of germs, such as covering your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze, wash your hands often with soap and water, avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth. Germs spread this way. Try to avoid close contact with sick people," said Gardner.

Hours of operation are Monday through Friday, 6:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. and 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday hours are 8 a.m. to 10 a.m. Previous recycling points are now closed and should only be used for nonrecyclable trash.

Assistant Public Works Officer, Lt. Johnathan Nieman, explained why NSA officials decided to change the way the Support Site recycles. "The problem we had with the previous arrangement was that recycling points would get contaminated," said Nieman. "Recyclables would get mixed up and treated like trash, so now what we've done is centralized the two recycling points so that all the recycling will be clean and everything will get picked up....The goal is to increase the overall amount of recyclables collected at the Support Site. This would drastically reduce the amount of trash sitting around."

"By the end of this year, the local community needs to have 50 percent of its urban waste recycled," Nieman stated. "If not, there will be fines."

Nieman also explained that city workers are allowed to pick up an infinite amount of recyclables, but with unsorted trash there is a

limit. Once that limit is reached, no more trash gets picked up. This explains why a lot of unsorted trash in the wrong places gets left behind at the Support Site.

Nieman offered some recycling advice to residents: "I would recommend sorting by local regulations. Here at the Support Site, it's glass, plastics, metals and

paper and cardboard. The other, most important thing is to crush and compact whatever you can [to] decrease even more the amount of trash we put out."

Balthazar Blake is a master sorcerer in modern-day Manhattan trying to defend the city from his arch nemesis, Maxim Horvath. Balthazar can't do it alone, so he recruits Dave Stutler, a seemingly average guy who demonstrates hidden potential as his reluctant protégé. The sorcerer gives his unwilling accomplice a crash course in the art and science of magic, and together, these unlikely partners work to stop the forces of darkness. It'll take all the courage Dave can muster to survive his training, save the city and get the girl as he becomes "The Sorcerer's Apprentice."

**INCEPTION**, PG-13 for sequences of violence and action throughout. Action/Adventure, Drama, Science Fiction/Fantasy and Thriller, 148 min. Cast: Leonardo DiCaprio, Marion Cotillard, Cillian Murphy, Ellen Page, Joseph Gordon-Levitt. Dom Cobb is a skilled thief—the absolute best in the dangerous art of extraction, stealing valuable secrets from deep within the subconscious during the dream state when the mind is at its most vulnerable. Cast: Sylvester Stallone, Jason Statham, Jet Li, Randy Couture, Mickey Rourke. A group of mercenaries is hired to infiltrate a South American country and overthrow its ruthless dictator. Once the mission begins, the men realize things aren't quite as they appear, finding themselves caught in a dangerous web of deceit and betrayal. With their mission thwarted and an innocent life in danger, the men struggle with an even tougher challenge, one that threatens to destroy this band of brothers.
