There's a seat for you on the shuttle bus

Want to save gas and miles on your car? Want to relax on your ride to and from work instead of stressing about the traffic? Most importantly, do you want to avoid the risk of not finding a parking spot at Capo?

Naval Support Activity Naples Commanding Officer Capt. Robert Rabuse added two additional shuttle bus runs from Support Site to Capodichino in the morning and two additional runs from Capo to Support Site in the evening. The bus schedule allows for the movement of 200 passengers each morning and evening, but currently only 100 passengers are taking advantage of this convenient ride.

The shuttle service has been increased to offset the impact of ongoing construction projects in the

vicinity of the front (west) gate. Currently, 145 parking spaces are secured on the roof of the west garage, and an additional 50+ parking space closures will take place as early as February to support solar panel installation on the west garage. Parking surveys have already indicated that both garages are nearing or at capacity by 9 a.m.

It is highly recommended that personnel utilize the shuttle bus to avoid any parking challenges. It's free and convenient, and can save you the trouble of a cold, rainy walk to your office. Carpooling is also strongly encouraged.

Copies of the bus schedule are available throughout Capo and the Support Site. Pick one up at the TLA, Capo Inn, libraries (JFC library too), USOs, ITTs, military air terminal, Capo gym, housing office, FFSC and PWD building.

Happy 107th birthday NMCRS!

One of the Navy's and Marine Corps' oldest and closest friends is another year older. Employees and volunteers of the Navy and Marine Corps Relief Society aboard Naval Support Activity (NSA) Naples, Italy celebrated the society's 107th birthday at their NSA Capodichino office, Jan. 26.

Founded 107 years ago on January 23, 1904 to care for widows and orphans of military personnel, 19 volunteers and \$9,000 (the Navy's share of gate receipts from the 1903 Army/Navy football game), laid the foundation of the Navy-Marine Corps Relief Society, which has served over 4 million sailors, marines and families, providing over \$1.1 billion in assistance.

The NMCRS is a charitable organization that relies on the talents and skills of volunteers and generosity of donors to provide financial and educational services to sailors and marines and their family members.

At NSA Naples a corps of dedicated volunteers supports the small administrative staff. "Being a volunteer with the NMCRS has given me more than I ever could have expected," said Desiree Hawkins, a local volunteer. "There is such a value in volunteering, not only are you giving back, but you are also developing valuable skills in the work place."

The local chapter teaches valuable skills to patrons, too. From offering advice on budgeting for a new baby to developing personal spending plans, and making house calls by visiting nurses to mothers with newborns, retirees and widows, the NMCRS is a great resource.

"The Navy-Marine Corps Relief Society is an integral part of the network of support that our sailors and marines depend upon," said Ray Mabus, Secretary of the Navy. They are available 24/7 to help you in times of financial need.

Funding change for Excelsior College tests

Effective Oct. 1, 2011, DANTES will no longer fund Excelsior College exams for service members. Service members who are in an Excelsior College program or who plan to pursue an Excelsior College degree should plan ahead, and if workable, take their Excelsior College exams prior to the program change. Upcoming construction projects at the Support Site

Starting on Monday, Jan. 31, the parking lot by the Pass & ID Office at the main gate of the Support Site will be expanded. Vehicular access into and out of the current parking lot will be limited to a single lane controlled by traffic flagmen. Construction work is estimated to be completed the following Monday, Feb. 7. All Pass & ID services will remain available during construction.

Following completion of work at the Pass & ID parking lot, construction will begin at the Village Forum 30-minute and handicap parking area. During construction, one parking stall at either end of this zone will be fenced off for a total loss of two parking stalls. Construction is currently scheduled to begin Monday, Feb. 7 and last for two weeks.

AFN radio update

AFN radio frequencies FM 106.0 and FM 107.0 stopped transmitting from the RAI tower on Mt. Camaldoli Sunday afternoon. This is due to the damage of RAI's antenna array, possibly from an earlier lightning strike. RAI is troubleshooting. AFN is still broadcasting via satellite, and TV services are unaffected.

AFN activated the 500 Watt standby transmitter and tower at the AFN station on the Support Site. Off-base residents can receive AFN radio by tuning decoders to channel 182 for FM 106.0 "The Eagle" and channel 183 for FM 107.0 "Powernet." Housing's decoders should already carry FM 106.0 as background audio on the TV program guide channel. There may be a relatively weakened signal in parts of the Support Site, and AFN radio will be largely unavailable on radios away from the Support Site.

Naples celebrates Chinese New Year Feb. 2-3

Naples will celebrate the Chinese New Year Feb. 2 and 3 in Piazza Plebiscito with several events that combine Chinese and Neapolitan cultural heritage. To close out the old year—the year of the Tiger—Castel dell'Ovo will be lit with a "Red China" light beginning at 8:30 p.m. Wednesday. At 9 p.m., a 30-minute fireworks display will illuminate the entire Bay of Naples. A parade with dragons, fireworks and dancing will kick off the Chinese New Year—the year of the Rabbit—at 3 p.m. The events are sponsored by the municipality of Naples.

Sanremo music festival

The north-western city of Sanremo will host the 61st edition of Italy's annual music festival from Feb. 15 through 19. The music festival has become a cultural event that displays Italian celebrities, as well. Each artist selects a song to perform for a panel of judges, which is made up of a popular jury and critics. Then the winner of the festival is selected based on the number of preferences. This year the festival will be hosted by Gianni Morandi, a former Italian pop star and co-hosted by Argentine model Belen Rodriguez and Italian model Elisabetta Canalis, who is also George Clooney's girlfriend. The festival will be aired by RAI national state TV.

Shoe designer funds Colosseum restoration

During a press conference in Rome, the mayor announced that Diego Della Valle, the famous Italian shoe designer of Tod's shoes, will spend €25 million to restore the Colosseum. The agreement was signed in Rome's city hall. Because there were some concerns over allowing corporate advertisers to use the 2000-year-old symbol of Rome to promote their products, the culture ministry and Rome city council representatives promised the sponsorship will not be allowed to put his name on the giant tarpaulin sheets masking the scaffolding during the restoration work of almost 13,000 square meters of

exterior walls. The monument will get a permanent illumination system, and new fire and security systems will be installed. The work will start at the end of this year and will take between 24 and 36 months.

Rome abandons plan to host Grand Prix

The mayor of Rome, Gianni Alemanno, announced the decision to "formally and definitely give up" on the plan to stage the Formula One Grand Prix in Rome in 2013. His project faced fierce opposition from local residents and from Bernie Ecclestone, president and CEO of Formula One Management and Formula One Administration, who said Italy could not host two Grand Prix races per year. Rome is still hoping to stage the 2020 Olympic Games.

Italy celebrates 150 years of unification

This year, Italy celebrates the 150th anniversary of Italian unification. The country dates its founding to 1861 when the Kingdom of Italy was proclaimed after a process that took decades. The major celebration will be June 2, Republic Day. Invitations were sent to the heads of 26 EU countries and to President Obama, President Medvedev of Russia, and President Rousseff of Brazil. March 17 is Italy's Flag Day, and it will be a one-shot national holiday this year. After the constitutional referendum on June 2, 1946, Italy became a republic. Until then, Italy was a monarchy ruled by the House of Savoy, kings of Italy.

13 arrested for 1989 Camorra massacre

Thirteen suspected members of two Camorra clans were arrested Tuesday. They are accused of a mass shooting that killed six people, including four who were not involved in the Neapolitan mafia, and wounded three, including a little girl, in the eastern part of Naples in 1989. These people were identified by one of the members of the clan who turned state's evidence.

home the third place trophy," said Carl Anthony, head coach.





Naples-area chief petty officers help curb drunk driving

In an effort to help curb drinking and driving, the Naples Area Chief Petty Officer Association (CPOA) helps area service members who have consumed too much alcohol make it back to base safely via Tippy Taxi.

When service members have been out drinking and can't pay for a cab ride back to base—whether they can't find an ATM or don't have enough money—they can call (or ask the establishment to call) a taxi. Tippy Taxi will pay the cab fare for rides to the main gate at either Capodichino or the Support Site. The CPOA asks that prior to the service members' arrival on base, they first call Tippy Taxi at 335-640-6597 so that a representative can meet them at the gate and pay their fare.

Although service members won't initially be charged for the ride, they are responsible to repay the CPOA within 30 days (two consecutive pay periods).

"Sailors should always have a plan in place when the chance of alcohol consumption is possible, but area leadership knows that sometimes those plans fall through. That is where we hope Tippy Taxi steps in to provide a safe ride," said Chief Operations Specialist (SW) Jason A. Wood, vice president of the Naples Area CPOA.

"The Tippy Taxi program gives our sailors a lifeline and another reason not to drive after drinking," said Chief Logistics Specialist (SW/AW) Jonizel Sioson, treasurer for the Naples Area CPOA.

The program is not designed to get Sailors in trouble and fares will not be reported back to the member's command.

"The area CPOA just wants to make sure that all of the sailors have a safe option when they may have had too much to drink," said Wood.

Web Tuition Assistance

Sailors can now receive tuition assistance for their continuing education by applying online and routing their Web Tuition Assistance (Web TA) applications electronically—saving both time and paper.

Web TA is available to all active duty personnel who have at least 12 months in their first permanent duty station. To receive tuition assistance, sailors must sign up before the beginning of class. If TA is approved, the Navy will pay for 16 semester hours of college credit per fiscal year with a limit of \$250 per semester hour.

Though sailors may apply for their classes at any time in the fiscal year, the key to success is an early application. Each quarter, the Virtual Education Center in Dam Neck, Va. will start processing applications 30 days prior to the first day of the quarter in which the class starts. All classes for that quarter are funded on a first-come, first-served basis using the command approval date. The VEC will not process late applications for tuition assistance. Thus, the key to success is to apply for Web TA early. TA applications can be edited after they are submitted, even if a course is changed.

"You want to get the command approval date as early as you can, because the Navy [VEC] works the Tuition Assistance program in a priority queue based on the command approval date. So each quarter, they will look at all the classes that start in that quarter, and the people who have the earliest command approval date will receive priority," said Sarah Smith, education counselor with the Navy College Office at Naval Support Activity Naples Capodichino.

Web TA makes it easier for sailors to manage their education and earn a degree. "This is my first time working with the Tuition Assistance program, but from everything that I have heard, after this I will be able to get Tuition Assistance online," said Hospital Corpsman 2nd Class (FMF) Trevor Parr, who's attached U.S. Naval Hospital Naples. "That will help me get my degree while I'm still in the Navy."

Naples' boys' basketball undefeated in Region IV

The Naples Wildcats basketball team dispatched the Vicenza Cougars (68-47; 68-38) this past weekend and is now 8-0 in league play. The Cougars were serious competition for the Wildcats. They are an experienced team and they know how to move the ball quickly down the court and drive in for incisive layups.

However, the Wildcats can do that and more! Team captain junior Jun Jun Gallardo has the driving power to pierce the Cougar defense to score. They also have height in senior Ryheam Trahan and junior Nigel Alexander, both of whom stand at 6'3" and worked in tandem to slice through the tough Cougar defense. Coach Shepherd noted that the rest of the team (which consists of eight freshman and three sophomores in addition to the seniors Edmondson and Melody Fears and junior Kierra Mims) are scrappy and feisty players. Though the team has not won a game this season, Coach Shepherd feels they have come a long way, and more importantly, they keep trying.

On Friday, the Lady Wildcats lost 32 to 53 against the experienced and well-seasoned Vicenza Cougars. The Lady

Wildcats came back to the courts Saturday, but did not quit. The Cougars dominated the courts offensively and defensively, but the Lady Wildcats played strong to the end. The Wildcats rallied in the last minutes of the game and were able to ratchet up their game, but the Cougars' lead was too large to overcome. Edmondson led scoring in both games (11 and 9) with Mims adding 10 points Friday and freshman Shelby Kimbro adding 8 points Saturday.
