OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH POLICY STATEMENT

1. The command shall establish and maintain an aggressive Occupational Safety and Health (OSH) Program. Managers and supervisors will ensure they understand their safety responsibilities and proactively make safety a part of the workplace culture. All employees shall be provided job safety and health training appropriate to the work they perform.
2. Injuries and occupational illnesses are preventable. However, injuries can't be prevented unless each individual makes the effort to protect themselves, their fellow workers, our customers, and government property. Individual commitment will eliminate mishaps and improve our quality of service.
3. All U.S. Naval Support Activity Naples, Italy and Tenant Command personnel will strive to establish and maintain a workplace that is free from hazardous conditions. We must all make a deliberate effort to institute Risk Management as part of the daily routine to help prevent mishaps.
4. All personnel shall promptly report all hazards, occupational injuries and illnesses to their immediate supervisor. Military mishaps, on and off duty, must be immediately reported via the appropriate chain of command. Each one of you is a member of the Safety Program.
5. As your Commanding Officer, I urge everyone to make Safety your highest priority. No Sailor or employee will be subjected to interference, coercion, discrimination or reprisal for exercising his/her rights and responsibilities under the safety and health program.
6. This policy shall be posted on all official bulletin boards.
