Subj: ANTI-TERRORISM/FORCE PROTECTION MILITARY UNIFORM WEAR  
POLICY GUIDANCE

Ref: (a) USEUCOM AT OPORD 11-05  
(b) EUCOM FRAGO 001 021450Z Nov 11

1. Purpose. To promulgate Anti-Terrorism/Force Protection (AT/FP) guidance regarding the wearing of the military uniforms off installation by Active Duty and Reserve personnel assigned to U.S. Naval Support Activity Naples, Italy.

2. Scope. Military uniforms will be worn per reference (a); specifically the Navy Work Uniform (NWU) is prescribed as the uniform of the day.

a. Per reference (b), the wearing of military uniforms (including Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (JROTC)) off U.S or host nation installations and/or outside of other controlled environments is authorized in Force Protection Conditions Normal, Alpha, and Bravo. During Force Protection Condition Charlie, military uniforms (including JROTC) are restricted from wear outside military installations. Military uniform wear is authorized for direct vehicle (not including motorcycle or bicycle) travel between domicile and duty locations (excluding hotels and other public locations) and when transiting between U.S. controlled areas. Uniform wear on public mass transportation (i.e. public mass transit train and bus lines) is prohibited. Uniform wear on Department of Defense (DoD) contract shuttle buses is permitted.

b. Personnel should make every effort to keep a low profile by reducing U.S./DoD appearance when outside military installations. When riding motorcycles or bicycles, personnel are required to wear civilian clothes. When in a privately

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owned vehicle, personnel are encouraged to remove or cover their uniform top to help maintain a low profile.

c. Government/Military marked vehicles and large occupancy vehicles (buses and vans) are restricted to on-base use only. This does not include Law Enforcement, Security or other military vehicles serving a purpose beyond personnel transportation.

d. Per reference (a), all personnel (to include those on leave) traveling within or arriving in the EUCOM AOR via commercial means will wear civilian clothing that does not readily convey affiliation with DoD. Military personnel traveling via military/military contract transportation will wear the uniform prescribed by their deployment or travel orders.

3. Any changes to the scheduled promulgation of this notice will be reflected in the Plan of the Week and sent via email for Department Head dissemination.

4. Cancellation. This notice will remain in effect for one year or until it is superseded by another notice, whichever occurs first.
