# Brazilian Tall Ship due at NAVSTA

The 249-foot Cisne Branco, the full-rigged sail training ship of the Brazilian navy that is participating in OpSail 2012, will make port of call at Naval Station Newport's Pier 2 on Saturday, June 23 through June 26.

The clipper will be open for tours to anyone with normal base access to NAVSTA, on Sunday and Monday from 2 to 6 p.m. Reservations are not required, but visitors will not be allowed to park on the pier so comfortable shoes are recommended for approximately a quarter mile walk to the ship.

Built in 1998 and homeported in Rio de Janeiro, the 152-foot tall ship is among at least seven international windjammers participating in a multi-port commemoration produced jointly with the U.S. Navy to celebrate the bicentennial of the War of 1812.

The ship is expected to leave Newport June 27 and rendezvous for OpSail 2012 in Boston, June 30 to July 6. She will then head south to visit the Coast Guard Academy in New London,

Conn., from July 6 to 9.

Other Tall Ships representing national maritime academies are from Russia, Spain, Argentina, Ecuador and Mexico. The Coast Guard Academy's barque Eagle is representing the United States.

Cisne Branco ("White Swan") was built in Amster-

dam, The Netherlands, by Damen Shipyard. She was christened in August 1999, delivered to the Brazilian navy in February 2000, and commissioned as a Brazilian naval vessel on March 9, 2000.

Cisne Branco is the third Brazilian navy sail-training yacht to carry the name.

She is normally used in national and international representation activities to showcase the Brazilian navy and Brazilian culture. She is also used as an instructional sailing ship by the cadets of the Brazilian Naval School, Academy of Merchant Marine, and other naval schools.

## O Canada

The coastal defence vessels HMCS Kingston (MM 700) and the HMCS Summerside (MM 711), Royal Canadian Navy, are rafted together at the end of Pier 2, Naval Station Newport, earlier this week for a port of call visit. Kingston is the lead ship of her class. Both ships are homeported in Halifax and are in the U.S. to participate in the War of 1812 commemoration during Fleet Week Boston, June 28 through July 6.

# Liaison officers needed to assist Tall Ships fleet

Ocean State Tall Ships Festival is taking place in downtown Newport, July 5-9, and the need remains for uniformed personnel to serve as ship liaison officers (SLO). Each ship will be assigned at least two ship liaison officers who will report to the senior ship liaison officer.

The SLOs are active duty or reserve Navy personnel assigned to Naval Station Newport or their tenant commands. They will be in uniform, and will be the direct liaison between the ships' captain/master and the Ocean State Tall Ships committee and the city of Newport.

The SLO teams will provide adequate ship liaison from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. daily (thus the desire for more than one per ship). Some of the duties will include meeting the ship on arrival and providing the captain's manual and area information; coordinating

with the dock master on ship requirements and special requests; assisting guests/VIPs in boarding during day sails; assisting the crew with non-ship related emergencies and much, much more.

# Simulated fire, fumes in HAZMAT building test united response

A training exercise, simulating a structural fire that caused casualties at Naval Station (NAVSTA) Newport's hazardous materials (HAZMAT)/Consolidated Hazardous Material Reutilization and Inventory Management Program (CHRIMP) facility, was conducted June 13.

The three-hour installation drill assessed the abilities of NAVSTA Newport's fire and emergency services

to respond to a building fire, and manage the care and evacuation of casualties.

The installation's Emergency Operations Center (EOC) was evaluated on its ability to track and manage a cloud of potential hazardous smoke that drifted away from the fire into a neighboring trailer park.

NAVSTA Security was evaluated on its ability to respond to a potential chemical incident and provide perimeter control. NAVSTA security personnel

# WAVES Unit 118 recognizes Military Woman of the Year

WARWICK — “These strong women allowed people like me to get where I am,” said Lt. Christie View during her remarks at a luncheon at the Greenwood Inn honoring her as the R.I. Military Woman of the Year for 2012.

View was acknowledging the more than 30 members of WAVES National, R.I. Ocean State Unit 118, colleagues from the Surface Warfare Officers School (SWOS), guests from the R.I. Department of Veterans Affairs, and former shipmates who arrived from San Diego just to help her celebrate this accomplishment.

This is the seventh year that Ocean State Unit 118 has honored one outstanding active duty military

woman in the state for outstanding individual achievement and service to community and country. Active duty members from all branches of military service are eligible for consideration.

View, an instructor at SWOS, was selected from nine other nominees by a board composed of members of WAVES Unit 118. Consideration of the award included military bearing, performance, specific accomplishments, involvement in extra professional activities, both in service and in the community.

## Red Cross honors 4 Navy heroes

MIDDLETOWN — The Rhode Island Chapter of the American Red Cross hosted a Flag Day community heroes celebration on June 14 at the Atlantic Beach Club. Over 200 attended the breakfast and award ceremony to recognize 19 heroes from the military and law enforcement, local firefighters and EMTs, and several good Samaritans who have made an impact in the community with their professionalism and hard work.

Four NHCNE staff members were among those honored for their team effort in saving the life of a fellow employee who suffered a cardiac arrest behind the wheel of his car on the clinic compound.

Cmdr. Robert Peterson, Lt. Cmdr. Bradley Ross, Lt. Sondra Jolly and Lt. Todd Pearson administered CPR and also used an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) to shock the staff

## NWC chief of staff retires

Capt. Russell Knight, a native of East Greenwich and Deputy/Chief of Staff at the Naval War College, retires today after 30 years of naval service.

Knight, who entered the Navy as an aviation officer candidate in May 1982 after receiving a bachelor of science degree in civil/ocean engineering at the University of Rhode Island, will be recognized for three decades of Navy service, with a State of Rhode Island proclamation declaring June 22 "Captain Russell P. Knight Day" in the state.

After earning his naval aviator "wings" in the A-6 Intruder aircraft in June 1984, Knight reported to Attack Squadron 55 (VA-55) in August 1985. He made two deployments aboard carrier USS Coral Sea (CV-43) and flew combat operations over Libya.

In August 1988, Knight returned to Attack Squadron 42 (VA-42) as an instructor pilot. The following January, he attended U.S. Naval Test Pilot School (USNTPS), with subsequent assignment to Strike Aircraft Test Directorate as the A-12 project pilot and test pilot for the A-6 Rewing Program. He returned to

USNTPS as a fixed-wing flight instructor.

After completing refresher training in VA-42, Knight joined Attack Squadron 85 (VA-85) in June 1993, and completed a Mediterranean Sea/Indian Ocean deployment aboard USS America (CV-66), participating in operations over Bosnia-Herzegovina, southern Iraq and Somalia.

Knight received orders to Attack Squadron 75 (VA-75) in July 1994, completing a Mediterranean Sea/Arabian Gulf deployment aboard the carrier USS Dwight D. Eisenhower (CVN-69). He

## NWC graduates urged to accept new challenges

Chief of Naval Operations (CNO) Adm. Jonathan W. Greenert told more than 500 graduates of the Naval War College (NWC) that bold and accountable leaders are needed to make difficult choices in a changing environment during graduation ceremonies at Naval Station Newport, June 15.

The CNO addressed the importance of their NWC educations and the importance it will have in current and future challenges that

will face them.

“Your studies here provide you an opportunity to reassess yourself, your situation and your service and to recharge yourself intellectually to see things more clearly,” said Greenert. “But you will see it isn’t that clear. That’s not the way the world is. Things aren’t as they appear.”

Greenert referred to the choices faced by the graduating class, balancing efforts and focus, and what the CNO needs from the graduating class.

point in the Navy. The draw down in Iraq and Afghanistan and the economic deficit dictate a need for a new strategy," said Greenert. "I expect you to apply the three tenets of warfighting first, operate forward and be ready—in your wardrooms and view your decisions through them."

Greenert joined NWC President, Rear Adm. John Christenson in presenting diplomas to graduates including 116 students who traveled to Newport and earned their degree through NWC's College of Distance Education.

In keeping with the tradition of NWC graduation ceremonies, Christenson gave graduates a final "charge" or challenge as they leave the college for higher leadership assignments.

"You depart Newport to be part of the solution, to win any war, and to defend freedom. You depart with greater trust and confidence in your service and international partners. You depart with the 'knowledge of centuries' directly relevant to the challenges of today. I wish you and your families success and happi-

ness in the years ahead," Christenson said.

The June graduating class of 2012 included almost 300 of the U.S. Navy, U.S. Marine Corps, U.S. Air

When combined with March and last November graduates, the 2012 graduation class is the largest in the college's 128-year history with 1,692 students.

completed his department head tour serving as maintenance officer until the squadron deployed aboard the USS Enterprise (CVN-65) in June 1996, the last deployment of the A-6 Intruder aircraft.

Knight attended the NWC as a student between August 1996 and June 1997 where he earned a master's degree in national security and strategic studies. At graduation he received the William S. Sims Navy League Award for outstand-

ing achievement while a student. He followed his studies as aide and administrative assistant to the director, Office of Program Appraisal, Office of the Secretary of the Navy.

Knight completed F/A-18 Hornet training with Strike Fighter Squadron 125 (VFA-125), and reported to Strike Fighter Squadron 147 (VFA-147) as executive officer in March 1999. He assumed command of the squadron in June 2000.

Following his change of

command, he temporarily filled the role of deputy air wing commander for Carrier Air Wing Nine before reporting to Navy Warfare Development Command as the air division head in January 2002.

In August 2004, Knight was assigned as the Navy Federal Executive Fellow at Tufts University's Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy.

Knight assumed command of Naval Air Station Meridian, Miss., on Aug. 12,

2005. After this command assignment, Knight reported to the NWC as the deputy chief of staff.

Knight ends his military career after more than 3,800 flight hours and 900 carrier arrested-landings while flying in more than 50 different types of aircraft.

His personal decorations include two Legion of Merit medals, two Meritorious Service Medals, three Air Medals, and other personal unit citations and commendations.



set up a perimeter that kept personnel isolated from the possible effects of toxic smoke. A fog machine produced the simulated toxic plume.

A NAVSTA Environmental representative, after making an assessment of the plume, determined the smoke cloud was caused by the structural fire and not by the hazardous materials in storage.

Exercise play included coordination with Newport and Middletown to evacuate residents of a nearby trailer park where the potentially toxic smoke had permeated.

A Commander, Navy Region Mid Atlantic (CNRMA) regional training team (RTT) assessed

the command's ability to conduct a complex training exercise that involved several functional mission areas as well as the installation's emergency operations center that was activated during the drill.

"The RTT assessment was important in proving that NAVSTA Newport has the ability to self train and conduct complex integrated exercises," said John Bozeman, installation training officer.

Representatives from the Rhode Island Emergency Management Agency were invited to observe the exercise.

The exercise was one of four training evaluations conducted each fiscal year.
